'Prof. Clive Orchard Mini Symposium'

Badrilla and the University of Leeds welcome and celebrate the research career of our Prof. Clive Orchard, from the University of Bristol.



Academic Career and Research

Areas

Prof. Orchard's research focuses on cardiac excitation-contraction coupling and its regulation. Using a variety of techniques his research has investigated how the rise of intracellular Ca ²⁺ that causes contraction is initiated, and how it is regulated by intracellular 2nd messenger pathways. Of particular interest is the role of the t-tubules in this process. He recently developed a technique that enables the physical and functional uncoupling of the t-tubules from the surface membrane, enabling us to investigate their function.

Prof. Orchard has taught and collaborated with a number of international and European researchers during his journey in the <u>"Regulation of cardiac-contraction coupling"</u>, which has enabled his research to continue in its journey to uncover yet more new and exciting findings. Prof. Orchard's enthusiasm and inspiration in his field can be reflected through his collaborators, some of whom are here today to share their research in this 'Mini Symposium' kindly sponsored by Badrilla.
